

## **St Michael's Church, Stratton St Michael**

### **General Information**

This pretty church still retains medieval features including a 14<sup>th</sup>-century chancel & piscina, and a 15<sup>th</sup> century font. It also contains an impressive set of late 17<sup>th</sup>-century communion rails.

Although fragments of medieval glass are still retained in the nave windows the majority of the stained glass was made in the 19<sup>th</sup> century by the local firm Joseph Grant of Costessey.

### **East, Chancel South and Chancel North Windows**

All were designed in the mid 19<sup>th</sup> century by Joseph Grant of Costessey and depict the following figures:

- East Window: Christ
- Chancel South : St Peter holding the keys to heaven and St John holding a poisoned chalice
- Chancel North: St Michael slaying a dragon

### **West Window**

Also designed by Joseph Grant the window is dedicated to the memory of Henry Nicholas Gwyn. Here, using enamels, Grant has painted Resurrection and Ascension scenes.

### **South Nave Windows 1/2/3 & North Nave Window**

All contain medieval fragments
