

All Saints' Church, Warham

General Information

This medieval church underwent an extensive Victorian restoration nevertheless it has retained some of its historic features including a Norman font (reputedly rescued from a nearby rockery), a piscina and transepts with 14th century arcades. There is one small panel of medieval fragments otherwise all the stained glass was installed after 1870 and includes work by Heaton, Butler & Bayne.

East Window

Designed c1879 by Heaton, Butler & Bayne the east window is dedicated to the memory 'of those who have gone to rest'. It depicts Christ the King surrounded by saints welcoming new arrivals to his heavenly kingdom.

Chancel South Window 2

One small tracery light contains medieval fragments.

South Nave Window 1

This window, dedicated to the memory of William Bishop Green, was inserted in 1924. The central light shows Christ as Good Shepherd over which an angel plays her harp in the sky.

South Nave Window 2

Designed by the Powell workshop c1920 this war memorial window carries a scroll declaring: 'Greater love hath no man than this: that he lay down his life for his friends'. Three military saints are pictured namely : St Joshua (left), St George (centre) and St Cornelius (right).
