General Information

This pretty church still retains medieval features including a 14th-century chancel & piscina, and a 15th century font. It also contains an impressive set of late 17th-century communion rails.

Although fragments of medieval glass are still retained in the nave windows the majority of the stained glass was made in the 19th century by the local firm Joseph Grant of Costessey.

East, Chancel South and Chancel North Windows

All were designed in the mid 19th century by Joseph Grant of Costessey and depict the following figures:

- East Window: Christ
- Chancel South : St Peter holding the keys to heaven and St John holding a poisoned chalice
- Chancel North: St Michael slaying a dragon

West Window

Also designed by Joseph Grant the window is dedicated to the memory of Henry Nicholas Gwyn. Here, using enamels, Grant has painted Resurrection and Ascension scenes.

South Nave Windows 1/2/3 & North Nave Window

All contain medieval fragments
